

AUXILIARY BOARD POSITIONS

Auxiliary Positions are at-will positions that are designed to support the Board of Directors. An auxiliary position can be held by any (paid) member of Indiana Players, Inc. who is 16 years of age or older. If you are interested in holding any open auxiliary positions, reach out to the board supervisor!

VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR: Assist with outreach and coordination of volunteers in all areas of operations for the Indiana Players including keeping and maintaining records and required paperwork for all IPI volunteers. They are under the supervision of the President. Interested? Email president@indianaplayers.com

BOX OFFICE MANAGER: Responsible for scheduling the lobby and box office personnel for all shows and other events in the theater. They are responsible for assuring that reservations are properly processed. They are under the supervision of the Treasurer. Interested? Email treasurer@indianaplayers.com

HARD-TECH COORDINATOR: Oversee the organization and maintenance of stage and set construction/storage areas; maintain a list of set pieces, tools, and materials as well as a sign-out and return record of all set pieces borrowed from IPI. Maintain lighting and sound systems. Keep a list of members and volunteers who have indicated a desire to work with hard-tech and assist each show director with securing stage crews and technicians for productions. SOFT-TECH COORDINATOR: Responsibilities include overseeing the organization and maintenance of all IPI props, costumes, and make-up belonging, including cataloging present and new items, and maintaining a sign-out and return record for the loan of any costumes or props. They will also maintain a list of all available Players who have indicated a desire to work with soft-tech and will assist each show director with securing adequate crews.
